A) Year 4 and Graduating Students must do the Self-Graduation Check before pre-enrollment and course add/drop.

Please download the study plan in FBA homepage and perform the relative checking from time to time (<https://fba.umac.mo/students/study-plans/>). Please ensure you have taken **all required courses** for graduation in your last year of study.

If you have NOT taken and passed all required courses in your curriculum, you will NOT be able to graduate. In addition, a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0 is required for graduation.

B) Quotas for Compulsory Courses and Major / Required Electives

Please check your enrollment plan at the FBA homepage (<https://fba.umac.mo/students/study-plans/>) before pre-enrollment and course add/drop to ensure you enroll in the correct courses. **Please make sure you have enrolled into all your compulsory courses and major/required electives.**

D) Courses / Major information

ACCOUNTING (ACCT) COURSES / MAJOR:

- ACCT210 Management Accounting I and ACCT213 Principles of Managerial Accounting are incompatible. Only 3 credit units will be awarded if students complete the said two courses. ACCT213 will **NOT** be offered starting from academic year 2018/2019, students who fail to take ACCT213 will need to take ACCT210 instead.
- The pre-requisite requirement of the courses below are revised starting from academic year 2017/2018.

- ACCT351/352 Internship for Accounting Function I/II, carry 1.50 credit units each course, are two consecutive semester required electives for ACC17-PAC17 students (B7 or after intakes). These courses **CANNOT** be counted as free electives for B6 or before intakes. Students intend to take these courses should submit the completed “Internship Acceptance Form” on semester basis and obtain approval from the course instructor concerned before enrollment. Application will be announced in due course.
- Graduates of the Bachelor of Science in Accounting (ACC) programme are awarded numbers of paper exemptions by Association of Chartered Certified Accountants (ACCA) and CPA Australia, provided that the corresponding UM courses are completed. - Students should follow the study plan in accordance with their major and intake. **NOT all ACCT courses are offered every semester**. ACCOUNTING AND INFORMATION SYSTEMS (ACIS) & ELECTRONIC BUSINESS (EBIS) COURSES / MAJOR:

- EBIS310 IT for Logistics and Supply Chain Management and QMDS311 Operations Management are incompatible. Only 3 credit units will be awarded if students complete the said two courses.
- ACIS450 Implementation of Accounting Information Systems is a final year level course. Students who do not have knowledge of database management, networking and communication,



as well as systems analysis and design are **NOT** recommended to take this course.

BUSINESS ECONOMICS (BECO) COURSES / MAJOR:

- Students are **NOT** allowed to take BECO100 Principles of Microeconomics and BECO101 Principles of Macroeconomics at the same time.
- Students **MUST** take BECO100 Principles of Microeconomics before they can take BECO101



Principles of Macroeconomics.

3. BECO201 Intermediate Economics is for FNC and FNM students only, and **NO** exchange student is allowed to take this course.
4. BECO210 Econometrics I is for FNC and FNM students only, and **NO** exchange student is allowed to take this course.
5. BECO403 Introduction to Econometrics is for BEC and BEC-SEC students only, and **NO** exchange student is allowed to take this course.
6. **IMPORTANT:** If a course is offered in the 1st semester, normally it will **NOT** be offered in the 2nd semester anymore with the exception of BECO100 and BECO101. A course will **NOT** be re-offered in the 2nd semester even if students need the course to graduate.
7. BEC and BEC-SEC students should carefully perform self-graduation check before pre-enrollment and course add/drop to ensure that you are able to complete all the required courses for gradation.

2. Courses from old programme (A8 or before intake) are not offered starting from academic year 2012/2013. 3. FINC434 Applied Financial Project is a two-semester course. Year-4 students should ensure that you have enrolled this course at the 1st semester of academic year 2017/2018. If you have not taken the course in the 1st semester, your graduation will be delayed.
4. Students should carefully perform graduation check before pre-enrollment and course add/drop to ensure that you are able to complete all the required courses for graduation.
5. Students who would like to join overseas exchange programme should go in their 2nd or 3rd year of study. You **MUST** stay in UM to complete the one-year applied research project (i.e. FINC434 Applied Financial Project) in your 4th year of study.
6. **IMPORTANT:** If a course is offered in the 1st semester, normally it **will NOT** be offered in the 2nd semester. A course will **NOT** be re-offered in the 2nd semester even if students need the course to graduate.

HOSPITALITY and GAMING MANAGEMENT (GAHM) & INTERNATIONAL INTEGRATED RESORT MANAGEMENT (IIRM) COURSES / MAJOR:

1. GAHM417 Global Issues in Gaming and Hospitality Management will be offered in the 2nd semester of academic year 2017/2018 for HGM11-CHM11 and HGM11-GMM11 students (B4 intake).
2. QMDS103 Logic and Reasoning and QMDS302 Casino Mathematics are **ONLY** offered in the 1st semester of academic year 2017/2018.
3. GAHM303 Quality Service Management is offered to HGM11-CHM11 students (B4 intake).
4. GAHM307 The Macao Gaming and Hospitality Industries are also offered to FBA students (B5 and B4 intake).
5. GAHM308 Festival and Event Management are offered to all HGM11 students (B4 or B5 intakes).
6. **GAHM320 Selected Topics in Human Resource Management is a newly offered course for all HGM11 students (B4 or B5 intakes).**
7. QMDS302 Casino Mathematics is offered in the 1st semester of academic year 2017/2018.

GLOBAL BUSINESS MANAGEMENT (GBMT) COURSES / MAJOR:

1. GBMT300 Global Business Environment is offered to students from GBS15, GBM11, MKG11 and MKG11-RSM11 (B5 intake) and all retaking students in this semester. Students from HRM11 and FIC15 will take this course in the 2nd semester.
2. GBMT302 International Management is offered to GBM11 and HRM11 students (B4 intake) in the 1st semester, **and this course will NOT be offered in the 2nd semester.**
3. GBMT402 Asian Business is offered to GBM11 students (B4 intake), **and this course will NOT be offered in the 2nd semester.**
4. GBMT403 Cross-Cultural Communication and Negotiation in Business, as well as, GBMT406 Entrepreneurship are **ONLY** offered in the 1st semester.
5. GBM11 students (B4 intake) are required to take **two** major electives totally in order to fulfill their graduation requirement. Please refer to FBA homepage for more information (<https://fba.umac.mo/students/study-plans/>).
6. Students should follow the study plan in FBA homepage by taking the compulsory courses and major electives in each semester. Otherwise, students may **NOT** graduate on time by taking wrong course(s). Please see the following example of GBM11 year-4 study plan:

MANAGEMENT (MGMT) COURSES / MAJOR:

1. MGMT110 Principles of Management is offered for students from ACC17, FNC17 and IIR17 (B7 intake), and all retaking students only.
2. MGMT220 Business Communications is offered to GBS15 students (B6 intake) and all retaking students only. Students from other majors will take this course in the 2nd semester.
3. MGMT221 Organization Behavior is offered to GBS15 students (B6 intake) in both 1st and 2nd semesters. Students who take MGMT221 in the 1st semester will take EBIS200 in the 2nd semester, and vice versa.
4. MGMT330 Strategic Management is **ONLY** offered to students from ACC13-PAC13, ACC13-AIS13 (B4 intake), FIC15, GBM11, MKG11 and MKG11-RSM11 (B5 intake) in the 1st semester, students from other majors will take this course in the 2nd semester.
5. MGMT331 Research Methods is offered to HRM11 students (B5 intake) in the 1st semester of academic year 2017/2018. Students (B5 intake) from other majors will take this course in the 2nd semester.
6. MGMT332 Human Resource Management is offered to students from FIC11 (B4 intake), HRM11, HGM11-CHM11 and HGM11-GMM11 (B5 intake).
7. MGMT481 (for B5-intake HRM11) and MGMT482 (for B4-intake HRM11) are **ONLY** offered in the 1st semester, **and both courses will NOT be offered in the 2nd semester.**
8. HRM11 students (B4 intake) are required to take **three** major electives totally in order to fulfill their graduation requirement. Please refer to FBA homepage for more information (<https://fba.umac.mo/students/study-plans/>).
9. Students should follow their study plan in FBA homepage by taking the compulsory courses and major electives in each semester. Otherwise, students may **NOT** graduate on time by taking wrong course(s). Please see the following example of HRM11 year-4 study plan:

MARKETING (MKTG) COURSES / MAJOR:

- MKTG220 Principles of Marketing is offered to students from ACC15 and FNC16 (B6 intake), and all retaking students. All other students will take this course in the 2nd semester of academic year 2017/2018.
- MKTG340 Consumer Behavior, MKTG411 Integrated Marketing Communications, and MKTG412 Marketing Strategy will **NOT** be offered in the 2nd semester. All MKG11 and MKG11-RSM11 students shall enroll in these courses in the 1st semester.
- MKTG410 International Marketing is offered to GBM11 students (B5 intake) in the 1st semester. MKG11 and MKG11-RSM11 students (B5 intake) can take this course in the 2nd semester.
- MKG11 and MKG11-RSM11 students (B4 intake) need to take **three** major electives to fulfill the graduation requirement. Please refer to the FBA homepage for more details (<https://fba.umac.mo/students/study-plans/>).
- In order not to delay your graduation, students should (a) finish all major compulsory courses by the 1st semester of the fourth year of study; and (b) follow the study plan in FBA homepage by taking the major electives in each semester.

QUANTITATIVE METHODS AND DECISION SCIENCES (QMDS) COURSES:

- QMDS100 Business Mathematics is a compulsory course for B6 or before intakes. FBA student (B7 or after intakes) should take GEST001 Quantitative Reasoning for Business to fulfill their graduation requirement.
- For students who would like to take QMDS course(s) as 3rd or 4th year level elective(s), they are advised to take QMDS301 Forecasting Models in Business, QMDS304 Advanced Calculus and QMDS400 Project and Quality Management.

For example:

Students who are planning to enroll in QMDS200 Statistics and Data Analysis, or who have already passed this course should not take QMDS201 Probability and Statistics, or vice versa. They are



incompatible subjects (belong to Group 2). Only 3 credit units will be given if students complete both QMDS200 and QMDS201.

- If students failed two or more courses appeared in the same group listed in item 4, passing one of these eventually does **NOT** mean they have retaken all failed courses. For instance, students who failed and try to retake both MSOR100 and QMDS101, they can enroll in QMDS100 as retake course for one of the two failed courses, but one more course is still required if they would like to retake both of them. - ◆ Students admitted in or after academic year 2017/2018 (B7 or after intakes) are required to take **TWO** courses from **EACH** of the 4 GE areas (including **ONE** compulsory course from **EACH** area as stated below). Additional GE course(s) taken will **ONLY** be counted as free elective(s). - ◆ In order to satisfy the GE requirement, students admitted between academic years 2011/2012 and 2016/2017 (B1 to B6 intakes) are required to take **TWO** courses from **Area 1** and **ONE** course from **EACH** of **Area 2 to 13**. Additional GE course(s) taken will **ONLY** be counted as free elective(s). For further details, please refer to the GE course list of your own intake (<https://fba.umac.mo/students/study-plans/>).



DISTRIBUTION/DIVERSITY (DE) COURSES:

- ◆ Students **admitted between academic years 2011/2012 and 2016/2017 (B1 to B6 intakes)** have to take DE courses in order to satisfy their curriculum. The four DE courses should be from four different major programmes/disciplines other than the student's own major programme. For the disciplines of each FBA major programme, you can refer to the FBA website for your reference (http://www.umac.mo/fba/bachelor/Diversity_elective.pdf).
- ◆ Please visit the Registry homepage (<https://reg.umac.mo/current-students/course-enrolment/generalinfo/>) for course disciplines.
- ◆ Students majoring in ACC11, ACC13-PAC13, ACC15-PAC15, ACC13-AIS13, ACC15-AIS15, FNC11, FNC16, FNC11-BKG11, FNC11-CFN11, FNC11-FNE11, FNC16-FNE16, FNC11-IMT11, GBS11, GBS15, BEC11, BEC15, BEC11-SEC11, BEC15-SEC15, ELB11, FIC11, FIC15, GBM11, HRM11, MKG11 and MKG11-RSM11 (B1 to B6 intakes) are required to take BBEL332 Business Law as one of their DE courses, thus other course(s) with discipline in "Law" will not be classified as their DE course(s).
- ◆ HGM11-CHM11 students (B1 to B6 intakes) have to take GAHM325 Hospitality and Tourism Law as one of their DE courses, thus other course(s) with discipline in "Law" will not be classified as their DE course(s).
- ◆ HGM11-GMM11 students (B1 to B6 intakes) should take GAHM323 Gaming Law and GAHM202 Psychology of Gambling as their DE courses, thus other course(s) with disciplines in "Law" and "Psychology" will not be classified as their DE course(s).

LANGUAGES AND SKILLS COURSES:

- ◆ **Students (B7 or after intakes)** are required to complete specific courses listed under the "Languages and Skills" component. "Languages and Skills" includes **THREE English Language courses, ONE Chinese or Portuguese Language course, and ONE Information Technology course**. Students who test out some or all of the Languages and Skills course(s) are required to make up the credits by taking additional 3-credit free elective(s). ENGLISH LANGUAGE COURSES:

- ◆ **Students (B7 or after intakes)** are required to take English language courses according to the placement level.
