Abstract

This seminar will be organised into three sections. The first part will entail a brief introduction of the overall development of Special Education in Taiwan, which includes outlining the Special Education Institutions at post-secondary levels, the different categories of Special Education at various educational stages, student ratios and modes of placement, as well as the critical factors that impact the development of Special Education in Taiwan. The second part will elaborate on personal perspectives of research in this field, including soliciting research funding, the primary research areas and themes. Lastly, the most recent research work and findings will be shared with the audience.

Speaker

Dr. Shih-Hui CHANG is currently Professor at the Department of Special Education in University of Taipei. He has conducted important research in special education, including validation of instruments, and pedagogy in primary school education. Prof. Chang has published more than 60 journal articles and authored 9 books on different topics in special education.
