Abstract:

This seminar seeks to discuss the following questions: How to understand the epic rise of China? What are the potential and prospects of China's mighty empowerment? What are the leading implications of the rise of China and what are the likely responses from the international community?

The Speaker:

Fei-Ling Wang is currently a visiting fellow at the University of Macau. He graduated from University of Pennsylvania, taught at the U.S. Military Academy (West Point), guest-lectured at thirty universities in ten countries, and held visiting/adjunct positions in China, France, Italy, Korea, Japan, and Singapore. He has published six books (two co-edited) and over 70 articles, book chapters, and essays in China, France, Hong Kong, Italy, Korea, Singapore, Taiwan, United Kingdom, and United States. He has been interviewed by media outlets including Al Jazeera, AP, BBC, CNN, Businessweek, CNN, Radio China International, The Financial Times, The New York Times, The South China Morning Post, TVB, UPI, The Wall Street Journal, and Xinhua News Agency. He is now a research associate of three research centers and a member of the Council on Foreign Relations.
