The Korean Peninsula is also a place where major power relations are the most complex and unpredictable in East Asia. This conference will assemble a group of prominent experts from China, South Korea, United States and Taiwan to conduct in-depth dialogues and discussions on various issues related to the peace and stability on the Korean Peninsula and Northeast Asia to promote mutual understanding and to reduce misperceptions among parties involved. The findings of conference will have both academic and policy implications.
