Abstract

Criminal Law in Europe has developed over centuries along lines that were quite different from those in England and America. It is particularly in connection with judicial errors that the two systems differ. The Anglo-Saxon system is less concerned about outcomes and more focused on the respect of procedural principles, whereas Europe tends to award priority to "fair" (and moderate) punishments. Data from the European Sourcebook of Crime and Criminal Justice Statistics on punishment and prisoners' rates will be used to document the differences.
