#### **Description:**

Women and gender study is now in the van of religious studies. Recent decades have seen a wellspring of remarkable scholarship on women and gender in various Chinese religious traditions. Notably, however, there has never been an international conference devoted specifically to such study. This conference for the first time in the world bring together active scholars of the field from North America, Europe, China, Taiwan, Hong Kong, and Macau to reflect on and explore common methodological and theoretical concerns as well as to facilitate dialogues and comparisons. The conference seeks to transcend established boundaries of religious traditions and academic disciplines, and define cross-cutting sets of analytical categories, including but not limited to: Chinese women's religious roles, activities, and experiences; the construction of femininity, masculinity, body, and sexuality in Chinese religious traditions; the intermingling of gender, religion and politics; art, literature, media and the gendered dimension of religion. The conference language is English.
