**“Immigration, Migration, and Crime in Germany:

**Abstract**

Some 15 per cent of the current population of the Federal Republic of Germany are semi-officially characterized as having a “migration background”. In a couple of big Cities the share goes up to some 30 per cent. In the southwestern city of Stuttgart, capital of the State of Baden-Wuerttemberg, more than 50 per cent of the upcoming youngest generation are stemming from parents or grandparents with foreign descent. This lecture will deal with the issue whether at all and, if yes, how far this big “ground wave” has been influencing the extent and phenomena of crime in Germany. In particular the question of “second generation” young offenders will be dealt with, notably violent offenses and group offenses among adolescent and young adult male minority members.
