Transformation of Ancient Chinese Texts

From Shangshu to Shiji

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<u>Abstract</u>

Chinese ancient books were produced, transmitted, and systemized during their long-term development, and this lecture mainly focuses on the text-transformation issues from *Shangshu* to *Shiji*. Vertically seeing the transformation process of Chinese ancient texts as the mainstream of the text-transformed form, it might began at *Yinshang* period and ended up at the time when Si Maqian finished *Shiji* during *Xihan* period. This is the initial stage for the production of Chinese ancient texts. There were four stages in this long-term transformation, considering Confucius as a remarkable demarcation; and the mainstream during this period was to transform those oral historical events into formal texts, and considering the same importance of oral events with formal historical texts, this was time when we would better call it the oral-recording age. This kind of classics went through difficulties and finally generated which might have many problems. Nowadays, scholars must take some correct measures to deal with these problems.

Biography:
