**Main Venue:** E4-G078, University of Macau

**Dates:** 11<sup>th</sup> & 12<sup>th</sup> December, 2017

**Rationale:**

The joint workshop on Europe and Asia relations, with a specific focus on the new trends of political leadership and global challenges, is proposed to be held in Macao in December 2017. This conference would bring together scholars from Asia and Europe in various fields of international relations, security studies, international political economy, international development, and global governance, among others. As these new and unprecedented trends and challenges are unfolding forcefully, it is highly desirable to do meaningful scholarly study and reflection on their impacts on Asia, Europe, and the prospects of global order. This is important in both academic and policy terms. The proposal was endorsed by Prof. Rui Martins, vice rector for research, the University of Macau, after a discussion and consensus among the members at the meeting of the EUAP-Macao management committee on 28<sup>th</sup> August, 2017.

The major themes for the conference are formulated along the following lines and reflected by four sessions and one round-table discussion.

## **Participants' Short bios**

### **Prof. ZHENG Yongnian**

*Director, East Asian Institute, NUS, Singapore*

Zheng Yongnian is the Professor and Director of East Asian Institute, National University of Singapore. He is the Editor of Series on Contemporary China (World Scientific Publishing) and the Editor of China Policy Series (Routledge). He is also the Editor of China: An International Journal and East Asian Policy.

He has studied both China's transformation and its external relations. His papers have appeared in journals such as *Comparative Political Studies*, *Political Science Quarterly*, *Third World Quarterly* and *China Quarterly*. He is the author of 13 books, including *Technological Empowerment*, *De Facto Federalism in China*, *Discovering Chinese Nationalism in China* and *Globalization and State Transformation in China*, and coeditor of 11 books on China's politics and society, including the latest volume *China and the New International Order* (2008).

In addition to his academic research work, Professor Zheng has also been an academic activist. He served as a consultant to United Nation Development Programme on China's rural development and democracy. In addition, he has been a columnist for *Xinbao* (Hong Kong) and *Zaobao* (Singapore) for many years, writing numerous commentaries on China's domestic and international affairs.

Professor Zheng received his B.A. and M.A. degrees from Beijing University, and his Ph.D. at Princeton University. He was a recipient of Social Science Research Council-MacArthur Foundation Fellowship (1995-1997) and John D. and Catherine T. MacArthur Foundation Fellowship (2003-2004). He was Professor and founding Research Director of the China Policy Institute, the University of Nottingham, United Kingdom.

### **Ambassador Michael Reiterer**

*Ambassador and Principal Advisor; European External Action Service, The European Union*

Michael Reiterer is member of the European External Action Service (EEAS) EU diplomatic service. In his previous experience, he joined the European foreign service in 1998 as Counselor for ASEM (Asia-Europe Meeting) (1998-2002), he was Minister/Deputy Head of the EC Delegation to Japan (2002-2006), EU-Ambassador to Switzerland and the Principality of Liechtenstein (2007-2011) and Principal Adviser to the Managing Director for the Asia

Pacific of the European External Action Service (2012-2016). Since February 2017 he serves as Ambassador of the European Union to the Republic of Korea.

Michael Reiterer studied law at the University of Innsbruck from where graduated in 1978 as doctor juris (Dr. jur.). Subsequently he obtained post graduate diplomas in international relations from the Johns Hopkins University, School of Advanced International Studies, Bologna Center (1979) and the Graduate Institute of International Studies (HEI) in Geneva (1985). In 2005 he was appointed adjunct professor ('Dozent') for international politics at the University of Innsbruck, Austria. Time permitting he teaches at various international universities and publishes on EU-foreign policy, EU-Asia relations with a particular focus on Northeast Asia, inter-regionalism, ASEM, human rights and cultural diplomacy. He is a frequent speaker at international conferences and interacts with think tanks. His memberships include Corresponding member of the Program Committee of the European Forum Alpbach, Consultative Council of the Vienna Institute for Economic Studies; Academic Consultative Council of the University of Kobe.

### **Prof. Jean-Pierre Cabestan**

*Hong Kong Baptist University, China*

Jean-Pierre Cabestan is Professor and Head, Department of Government and International Studies at Hong Kong Baptist University and Director General of the European Union Academic Programme in Hong Kong. He is also associate researcher at the Asia Centre at Sciences Po, Paris and at the French Centre for Research on Contemporary China, Hong Kong.

His main research interests are Chinese politics and law, China's foreign and security policies, China-Taiwan relations and Taiwanese politics. His most recent publications include *China and the Global Financial Crisis: A Comparison with Europe*, Routledge, 2012 (ed. with Jean-François Di Meglio & Xavier Richet) and *Secessionism and Separatism in Europe and Asia*, (ed. with Aleksandar Pavkovic), Routledge, 2013.

### **Prof. Henning Glaser**

*German-Southeast Asian Center of Excellence, Thammasat University, Thailand*

Henning Glaser (born 1971) is since 2009 the founding director of the German-Southeast Asian Center of Excellence for Public Policy and Good Governance (CPG) at Thammasat University, jointly formed by the Universities of Münster, Frankfurt, Passau and Thammasat University. Since 2007 he is teaching German and comparative constitutional law at the Faculty of law of Thammasat University. Prior to his engagement at Thammasat University

he had been working as an assistant professor at the Faculty of Law of Münster University, as an attorney at law and a consultant. Henning Glaser serves as a consultant to numerous governmental and nongovernmental agencies in Europe, America and Asia in various fields of law, governance and compliance. Among his research areas are the critical theory of governance and compliance as well cross-cultural compliance. He is author of “*Cross Cultural Compliance in Thailand*”, in *Rechtsmanagement im Unternehmen, Praxishandbuch Compliance, Aufbau, Organisation und Steuerung von Integrität und regelkonformer Unternehmensführung*, ed. ### **Prof. HAO Yufan**

*University of Macau, China*

Dean of Faculty of Social Sciences and Chair Professor of Political Science at University of Macau. As an internationally known expert in International Relations, he obtained his MA and PhD from the Johns Hopkins University School of Advanced International Studies in 1984 and 1989 respectively. He was a McArthur Fellow at Harvard University Center for International Affairs 1988-1989, and taught at Colgate University from 1990 to 2005, holding an endowed Chair of Robert Hung Ngai Ho Professor of Asian Studies from 2003-2005. He became the Dean of Faculty of Social Sciences and Humanities at University of Macau from 2005 -2013. He was a senior visiting professor to Beijing Normal University (1993), Peking University(1999-2000), Tsinghua University(2003), Renmin University of China(2003), and an international fellow at Johns Hopkins Nanjing Center(2005), senior visiting fellow at Keio University (2006-2007), visiting fellow at the Brookings Institution (2012). Currently, he is an honorary jianzhi professorship at Fudan University, Shanghai University of International Studies, Beijing Foreign Affair University, Sun Yat-sen University, Jinan University, Harbin Normal University and etc. In addition to serve in the editorial board of several leading academic journals in China and Asia, he is also editor-in chief of *Journal of Macao Studies*, and *Macao Blue Book*. He has written and edited 29 books and monographs and authored more than 50 journal articles and chapters in books on Chinese politics, Chinese foreign relations, U.S.-China relations, Macao Studies, publishing in such journals as *Asian Survey*, *Asian Perspective*, *Journal of Democracy*, *Journal of Contemporary China*, *the China Quarterly*, *Issues and Studies*, *Chinese Social Science Quarterly*, etc. He is also a regular contributor to *China Newsweek*, *Global Times*, *Caijing Magazine* and *Nanfeng Chuang* in China.

## **Prof. Bertel HEURLIN**

*University of Copenhagen, Denmark*

Bertel Heurlin is professor of Political Science and Jean Monnet Chair of European Security and Integration at the University of Copenhagen, Department of Political Science. He is Project Director, China Security Studies, Centre for Military Studies, Department of Political Science, University of Copenhagen, Coordinator Danish Reflection Group China and Co-coordinator and Member of the Core Group of ThinkChina.dk, a newly established Danish Think Tank on China, University of Copenhagen, [www.ThinkChina.dk](http://www.ThinkChina.dk). Also his is co-director for COMER, Copenhagen Middle East Research Project.

He is commentator in Danish and international media. For many years he has been working as an expert and an advisor for Danish ministries (MOD and MFA) and for NATO. He is a member of the board of ECMI, European Centre for Minority Studies.

Bertel Heurlins scholarly field is international politics, strategy, arms control, foreign policy, security policy and defence policy. Country and area studies include USA, USSR/Russia, China, Europe and the Northern Countries. He has written or edited 60 books and more than 200 scholarly articles and book chapters.

## **Prof. Fernanda Ilhéu**

*Lisbon School of Economics and Management, University of Lisbon, Portugal*

Fernanda Ilhéu is a professor at Lisbon's School of Economics and Management (ISEG), where she also coordinates *ChinaLogus – Business Knowledge & Relationship with China*, a research and consultant center. Prof. Ilhéu's undergraduate study was on economics at ISCEF (now ISEG), and his post-graduate study was on marketing and export management at the Cambridge Institute of Massachusetts. He got his Master's degree in strategic management at Lisbon's ISCTE, and a European doctorate degree in business administration and marketing at the University of Seville. She is presently President of the New Silk Road Friends Association a Portuguese Think Tank on OBOR initiative.

## **Prof. LIU Tiewa**

*Beijing Foreign Studies University, China*

Liu Tiewa's main research focus is on the United Nations, international organizations and North-East Asian studies. She is the associate professor in School of International Relations and Diplomacy at Beijing Foreign Studies University (BFSU) and Deputy Director of Research Centre of the United Nations and International Organizations at BFSU. She is also an Advisory Board Member and China Program coordinator of Asia Pacific Centre for the Responsibility to



Protect at the University of Queensland in Australia where she was a visiting fellow from June 2014 to June 2015. In recent years, she has mainly worked on R2P, peacekeeping and peace building operations among her recent publication are “*The Comparative Studies of US and China’s Engagement in UN Peacekeeping Operations*”, The Journal of International Studies, 2017; “*Peace-building in Fragile States and Human Security: How to Realize Security and Development under g7+ Framework*”, Social Science, 2015; *The Responsibility to Protect: Chinese Perspectives on Norm Building*, (Chinese, chief editor), Peking University, 2015; “*Chinese Strategic Culture and the Use of Force: Moral and Political Perspective in Contemporary Chinese Diplomacy*,” The Journal of Contemporary China, Vol. 23, No. 2014; *Hegemonic Status and Institutional Openness: Analysis of the US Influence in the International Organizations (1945-2010)*, (Chinese), Peking University Press, 2013; “*China and Responsibility to Protect: Maintenance and Change of Its Policy for Intervention*”, The Pacific Review, Vol. 25 No. 1 March 2012.

### **Mr José Carlos Matias**

*President of the Macau Portuguese and English Press Association, Macao*

Mr. José Carlos Matias Dos Santos is a Macau-based journalist, researcher and member of the Board of Directors of the Macau Portuguese and English Press Association. Between April 2010 and March 2013 he is a member of the research project “Assessing the “One Country, Two Systems Formula: The Role of Macau in China’s Relations with the European Union and the Portuguese Speaking Countries”, based at the Center for Social Studies at the University of Coimbra, Portugal.

His main research interests include the external relations of Macau and Hong Kong, Chinese foreign policy, China-Portuguese Speaking countries relations and European Union-China relations.

### **Prof. Dragan Pavličević**

*Xi'an Jiaotong - Liverpool University, China*

Prof. Dragan Pavličević is Lecturer at the Department of China Studies, Xi'an Jiaotong - Liverpool University. He researches on both China's domestic and foreign affairs, and is particularly interested in participatory politics, China's relations with Europe, and the politics of China's overseas infrastructure projects. Dragan's research has been published in both academic and think-tank publications.

## **Dr. SHENG Sixin**

*International Cooperation Centre, National Development and Reform Commission, China*

Dr. Sheng Sixin is researcher and director of the Office of International Cooperation and Research Management at the National Development and Reform Commission, and he is currently a visiting scholar at Harvard University's Fairbank China Studies Center.

## **Prof. SONG Weiqing**

*University of Macau, China*

Weiqing SONG is Associate Professor of Political Science and coordinator of European Studies Programme at Department of Government and Public Administration, the University of Macau. Professor Song's research focuses on Chinese foreign policy, particularly, with respect to global governance. He also conducts research on European politics with an emphasis on European Union and European foreign policy, discourse analysis in international relations, and Chinese politics with a focus on post-socialist regime and regional politics. He has published three monograph and edited volumes on Chinese foreign policy and Sino-European relations, apart from a number of journal articles and book chapters.

## **Prof. Pascal Vennesson**

*Nanyang Technological University, Singapore*

Prof. Pascal Vennesson is professor of political science at the S. Rajaratnam School of International Studies (RSIS), Nanyang Technological University, Singapore. His research and teaching lie at the intersection of the fields of international relations and strategic studies. He is the author, co-author and editor of six books and his refereed articles have been notably published in *Armed Forces and Society*, *International Relations*, *Journal of Strategic Studies*, *Review of International Studies*, *Revue Française de Science Politique (French Political Science Review)* and *Security Studies*. He co-authored *ASEAN's External Agreements: Law, Practice and the Quest for Collective Action* (with Marise Cremona, David Kleimann, Joris Larik and Rena Lee, Cambridge: Cambridge University Press, 2015). Before joining RSIS, he held the Chair "Security in Europe", at the European University Institute, Robert Schuman Center for Advanced Studies. He also taught "strategy and policy" for ten years at the Paul H. Nitze School of Advanced International Studies (SAIS)-Bologna Center and "European Union's Diplomacy, Security and Defense: Instruments and Common Policies" at the College of Europe. He received his MA from the University Paris I Panthéon-Sorbonne and his Ph.D. from *Sciences-Po* Paris.

### **Prof. Sten Idris Verhoeven**

*Faculty of Law, University of Macau, China*

Sten Idris Verhoeven (PhD the KU Leuven 2002). In 2002–2003 he studied international relations and conflict prevention at the same university. From 2003–2009, he was a research-and-teaching assistant at the Institute for International Law at the KU Leuven. In September 2009, he joined the University of Macau as Senior Instructor. In 2013 he became Assistant Professor teaching international and European Union law. His interests are legal theory as applied to international and EU law, constitutionalism in international and EU law, human rights and international criminal law.

### **Prof. WANG Jianwei**

*University of Macau, China*

Jianwei Wang is Professor in the Department of Government and Public Administration and director of Institute of Global and Public Affairs at the University of Macau. He holds a Ph.D. in Political Science from the University of Michigan and a B.A. and M.A. in International Politics from Fudan University (Shanghai). Previously, he was Distinguished Professor of Political Science at the University of Wisconsin-Stevens Point. He has also served as a research fellow and visiting scholar at George Washington University's Sigur Center for Asian Studies, the Atlantic Council of the United States, the East-West Center (Hawaii), and the United Nations Institute for Disarmament Research in Geneva. His teaching and research focus on East Asian politics and security, Chinese and American politics and foreign policy, Sino-American and Sino-Japanese relations, and UN peacekeeping operations. He has published extensively in these areas.

### **Prof. WU Xiangning**

*Sun Yat-sen University, China*

Xiangning Wu held her Ph.D from the University of Birmingham, UK. She worked for the Institute of International and Strategic Studies, Peking University as a research associate and program coordinator for MacArthur Foundation Project from 2010 to 2015. She finished her postdoctoral research at the School of International Studies, Peking University in 2015. She also served as a project director for Institute of US-China People-to-People exchange, Peking University from 2013-2015. Before joined UM, she worked as a research fellow at the School of International Relations, Sun Yat-sen University.

### **Prof. YOU Ji**

*University of Macau, China*

You Ji (B.A. Peking and PhD ANU) is professor of international relations and head of Department of Government, University of Macau. He is author of four books, including *China's Military Transformation* (Polity, 2016); and *The Armed Forces of China* (Allen & Unwin and I.B. Tauris, 1999); *China's Enterprise Reform: Changing State/Society Relations after Mao*, (Routledge, 1998) and numerous articles. *Fudan University, China*

Yu ZHENG is professor at the School of International Relations and Public Affairs (SIRPA), Fudan University. He received Ph.D. from the University of California, San Diego and a postdoctoral fellowship at the Princeton Harvard China and the World Program. Before joining Fudan, he worked at the University of Connecticut as an Associate Professor. His research interests include international development, foreign direct investment, and business-government relations. He is author of *Governance and Foreign Investment in China, India, and Taiwan: Credibility, Flexibility, and International Business* (University of Michigan Press, 2014). His publications have also appeared in journals such as *Comparative Politics*, *Public Opinion Quarterly*, *Socio-Economic Review*, *Studies in Comparative International Development*, and others.
